

#### SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

"Lord, it is good that we are here (Mt 17:4)." Every time we come to Mass, we are at the mountaintop with our Lord who reveals Himself to us in the Eucharist. Lent is marked by the traditional observances of

Prayer, Fasting, Abstinence and Almsgiving.

PRAYER: Consider daily mass and personal scripture reading during Lent. The Stations of the Cross, a devotion to the suffering of Christ on his journey to Calvary will be prayed each Friday at 3pm and 5pm in the Church. **The Word Among Us** is also available for your daily prayer and reflection during this season.

**FASTING**: Catholics, ages 16 to 59, are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Lenten practice of Fasting is as follows: one main meal, two smaller meals, and no food in-between. We should be hungry, not starved. Those needing to eat with medication may do so.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT: This is an Obligation for all Catholics on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.
