

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

In today's Gospel, the Lord goes to battle for us and teaches us how to deal with temptations. He does what our first parents failed to do in the Garden of Eden in dealing with three temptations we struggle with: Sensual Gratification, the desire for power or riches, and pride. The remedies the Lord presents for us are fasting and abstinence in the face of sensual gratification. Through His Grace we can learn selfcontrol over the passions which overwhelm us. Almsgiving in dealing with the desire for power or riches. When we practice detachment from the things of the world whether we are rich or poor, we grow to rely primarily on God's gifts as the keys to our happiness. Prayer and living by the Lord's Commandments dealing with pride. In strengthening our relationship with the Lord in prayer and observance of His commandments, we learn humility and to live relying on Jesus' teachings. Note that Jesus allowed Satan to tempt Him. He allowed the creature to tempt Him in His human nature as a sign of His truly being like us in all things but sin. May we remember the words of our Lord who tells us in the Gospel of Matthew, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." Matthew 11: 29-30

LENTEN PRACTICE REMINDERS

Lent is marked by the traditional observances of

Prayer, Fasting, Abstinence and Almsgiving.

PRAYER: Consider daily mass and personal scripture reading during Lent. The Stations of the Cross, a devotion to the suffering of Christ on his journey to Calvary will be prayed each Friday at 3pm and 5pm in the Church. The Word Among Us is also available for your daily prayer and reflection during this season.

FASTING: Catholics, ages 16 to 59, are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Lenten practice of Fasting is as follows: one main meal, two smaller meals, and no food in-between. We should be hungry, not starved. Those needing to eat with medication may do so.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT: This is an Obligation for all Catholics on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

ALMSGIVING: Consider works of charity, service, or financial sacrifices during Lent.
