May 19, 2024 Pentecost Sunday

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION THIS WEEK

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples of Jesus. The Acts of the Apostles tells us that the Holy Spirit descended like tongues of fire upon them, and they began to speak about the mighty deeds of God. In the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, we received the Holy Spirit and are commissioned to speak about the mighty deeds of God in word and action. In doing so, we do not rely on our own powers. Rather we are empowered by the Gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord which is also called Awe. With these gifts, the Church throughout the centuries has gone out to all the world to speak of the mighty deeds of God in order to build up the Body of Christ and to bear fruit for the Kingdom of God. The Church teaches as found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraph #1832, The fruits of the Spirit are perfections that the Holy Spirit forms in us as the first fruits of eternal glory. The tradition of the Church lists twelve of them: "charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity.' Through His Church, many of Jesus' sheep from many nations have heard His voice speaking to their hearts and now follow Him. We can see this as we look at our own parish. Many people from different cultures come to celebrate as one in the Eucharistic Feast. Let us continue to respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit using the Gifts we have received to speak of the mighty deeds of God in the context of our own vocation so that the Lord's sheep can hear His voice and follow Him.


