June 2, 2024 The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Church teaches that the Holy Eucharist makes Jesus present to us always. The Eucharist is also called the Source and Summit of our Faith. It is supernatural food for our souls, which as Question 292 in the Compendium of the Catechism tells us..... increases our union with Christ and with his Church. Furthermore, the Holy Eucharist "preserves and renews the life of grace received at Baptism and Confirmation and makes us grow in love for our neighbor. It strengthens us in charity, wipes away venial sins and preserves us from mortal sin in the future."

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus institutes this new Sacrament in which He offers His Body and Blood as the living sacrifice of a new covenant of love. In the Gospel of John 6:22-59, we have the Bread of Life Discourse in which Jesus tells the Jewish crowds that unless they eat his flesh and drink his blood, they will not have life in them: eternal life. This hard teaching prompts many to walk away from Him; However, He does not change this teaching or refers to it as simply symbolic talk. Rather, He lets them go. As Catholics we accept Jesus' teaching literally. Today, our Lord, asks us to accept Him as the Way, the Truth and the Life. As we come forward to receive His Body and Blood, may we truly mean our "AMEN" when we hear the words, "The Body of Christ...The Blood of Christ" and receive His life-giving food.



The Society of Divine Vocations, also known as the **VOCATIONIST FATHERS**, is a religious congregation founded by **Saint Justin Maria Russolillo**, in **Pianura**, **Naples – Italy in 1920**. The Vocationist Fathers has its main charism as "identifying and fostering vocations to the priesthood and religious life, especially among the less privileged".

They work in Vocationaries, parishes, schools, and missions. Currently, our missionary spirit serves the people of God in Italy, Brazil, the U.S.A., Argentina, Nigeria, Philippines, India, Madagascar, Colombia, Ecuador, Indonesia, the United Kingdom, Chile, Canada, France, Australia, South Africa, Vietnam, Spain and Papua New Guinea.

Fr. Justin established the Vocationist Fathers and their special charism to foster and promote vocations to the priesthood, religious life, and holiness among all God's people. To carry on this vocational work Fr. Justin established the Vocationary, a special house of formation that would supply vocations to both religious order and diocesan seminaries. The Vocationary was established specially to attend to the needs of those financially unable to attend the seminary and those who are still searching and discerning their vocation. We have more than 600 seminarians in formation in the different parts of the world.

The Vocationists' spirituality stems from Fr. Justin's conviction that all people are called to holiness. Their "first duty" is to be with God. Their ultimate goal is to achieve the Divine Union. St.Justin Russolillo was canonized on May 15, 2022 by Pope Francis.

Rev. Leo Antony, SDV was born in Kerala, India and joined the Vocationist Fathers in India in 1998 and was ordained a priest in 2010 and served our missions in different countries. Fr. Antony is going to talk to you from his experience in the missions on **Sunday June 16th**.
